PRACTICE ROUNDS

Practice rounds may be played May 26 - June 1 upon availability. Tee time may be scheduled one week prior to requested date. Call 281-348-2217. If more than one practice round is desired, the fee will be \$50 and includes cart fee.

ELIGIBILITY

Entries are open to amateur golfers: 1) female at birth; 2) have a handicap index not exceeding 18.4 under the USGA Handicap System, and 3) a member of a club, women's golf organization or a college student attending a school in one of the fifteen southern states or the District of Columbia. Membership dues must be paid to Women's Southern Golf Association for 2008.

All entries are subject to the approval of both the WSGA Tournament Committee and Host Club. Appropriate golf attire **must** be worn. Golf shoes must have soft-spikes.

WSGA reserves the right to use all photographs taken during the tournament on the WSGA website and in press and promotional releases.

ENTRY PROCEDURE

The entry fee is \$245 and includes one practice round, the qualifying round and two rounds of match play with carts, practice balls, club storage, gratuities and social events. Cart fees for Thursday and Friday matches are \$25 and must be paid in the Golf Shop. Cart fees are mandatory.

The fee for WSGA Non-playing Officials is \$70.

The entry fee will be refunded if requested by 5:00 PM (CDT) Friday, May 23. A \$15 administrative fee will be deducted from all refunds. **No refunds for cancellations after May 23.**

The field will be limited to 96 players and the Committee reserves the right to limit the field size. Players with the lowest 48 Handicap Indexes and ties will be accepted when the application is received by Friday, May 2. The remainder of the entries will be accepted in the order of receipt. If entries exceed 96 a wait list will be established in the order of entry receipt. Notification of acceptance or placement on the waiting list will be mailed May 5.

Entry Deadline: Friday, May 2, 5:00 PM (CDT) The Committee reserves the right to extend the deadline if the field is not full. Entries received after the closing date will be placed on the wait list by Handicap Index.

RULES OF PLAY

All competition will be played in accordance with the USGA Rules of Golf.

The low 32 qualifiers will constitute Championship Flight. Any ties for last place in the Championship Flight will be decided by a hole-by-hole play-off held immediately following the Qualifying Round. Any player tied and not present at the time of the play-off will forfeit her right to play in the Championship Flight and will be paired in the First Flight.

Championship Flight players must walk and will have assigned cart drivers/caddies. No personal caddies will be allowed. After the first round of match play, contestants in Championship Consolation Flight will use carts

All other flights will be composed of 16 players who use carts. Ties for 16th place in these flights will be determined by the order in which the scorecards are returned.

Final matches in first - fourth flights will play 18 hole matches. The final match in Championship Flight will play a 36 hole match.

It is the responsibility of all players to continue in Match Play after qualifying. Withdrawals will be referred to the Championship Decisions Committee.

TROPHIES

MEDALIST - The Evelyn Monsted perpetual trophy will be awarded to the contestant having the lowest qualifying score.

SENIOR MEDALIST- The Marguerite Gaut perpetual trophy will be awarded to the contestant 50 years of age or older having the lowest qualifying score.

JUNIOR MEDALIST- The Marty Webb perpetual trophy will be awarded to the contestant who has not reached her 18th birthday before the end of the Championship and who has the lowest qualifying score.

LOW NET TROPHY- The annual Riely Eakin Memorial Trophy will be awarded to the contestant having the lowest net qualifying score.

TEAM TROPHY- The lowest combined qualifying scores of any two competitors from the same club will determine the winners of the perpetual Team Trophy.

The club formally opened with the notable Island Course in 1974, designed by Joe Finger. The Lake Course was added in 1977, Marsh Course in 1983 and Forest Course and Golf Advantage School in 1996. In 1997 Kingwood Country Club welcomed the Deerwood Club into its fold and in 2002 Atascocita Country Club became one of the three Clubs of Kingwood, increasing the number of holes of golf to 117.
