NOTICE TO PLAYERS

Play is governed by the United States Golf Association (USGA) Rules of Golf and its Interpretations, 2020 Women's Southern Golf Association Local Rules and Terms of Competition ('Hard Card') and where applicable, the following Local Rules. All local rules listed on Old Waverly Golf Club scorecards, posted on notice boards or posted on the course are not in effect for this tournament

1. **Format:** The Championship is contested over 54-holes of stroke-play. Upon completion of Round 2, the field will be broken into flights based on 36-hole totals.
2. **Tees:** The Championship Division players will compete from the **YELLOW** WSGA tee markers. The Tournament Division players will compete from the **BLUE** WSGA tee markers.
3. **Transportation:** Players **MUST** ride during the championship. Each player will have her own cart for each round of the championship. Personal caddies are not permitted during the championship.
4. **Procedure for Ties:** In the event of a tie for the championship, a sudden death hole-by-hole playoff will be conducted immediately after all scores have been verified. All announcements pertaining to the playoff will be made at the scoring area.
5. **Scoring:** Scores must be attested and verified verbally immediately after completing the round to the designated WSGA scoring area, which is adjacent to the Golf Shop. The scorecard is considered returned when the player verbally approved what is online/the screen in scoring.

SUPPLEMENTAL RULES OF PLAY

1. **Out of Bounds:** In addition to the items listed on the Women's Southern Golf Association Hard Card, Out of Bounds is defined by:
 - a) Perimeter property fence posts, walls, white stakes, white dots and white lines;
 - b) The metal and wood fence posts right of hole #5
 - c) The course-side edge of the white stakes right of hole #9
 - d) The course-side edge of the curbing right of hole #12
 - e) The course-side edge of the road left of and curbing behind hole #16

Note: A ball that cross a paved roadway and comes to rest on another part of the golf course is still deemed to be Out of Bounds.
2. **Immovable Obstructions:** Include, but are not limited to:
 - All artificially surfaced roads and paths (including worn areas next to path), permanent restrooms, memorial plaques, bird houses, split-rail fences, and the decorative planting completely encircled by cart path behind 7th putting green.
 - Immovable obstructions close to putting green: Model Local Rule F-5 is in effect but is modified to provide relief only when the ball and immovable obstruction are in the general area of fairway height or less. The obstruction must be within two club lengths of the green and the ball must be within two club lengths of the obstruction.
 - Immovable obstructions within or adjacent to each other, such as asphalt paths adjacent to other structures or sprinkler heads near putting greens, are treated as a single obstruction.
 - White stone wall behind hole #9 putting green: If a player chooses to take relief under Rule 16.1 from this obstruction, the nearest point of complete relief must be determined without crossing over, through or under the obstruction
3. **Penalty Areas:**
 - **Dropping Zones – Hole #12:** If, during play of hole #12, a ball is in or it is known or virtually certain that a ball that has not been found lies:
 - in the red penalty area left of hole #12 putting greenthe player may:
 - proceed under Rule 17.1d; or
 - as an additional option, drop the original ball or another ball, under penalty of one stroke, in the designated dropping zone (marked "DZ") located on the forward tee.
 - In front of the putting greens on holes #6 and #18, the penalty area is defined by the green-side edge of the stone wall where the painted line is not present.
4. **Doubt as to Procedure:** If a competitor is in doubt as to a procedure under the rules and a referee is not proximately available, to avoid delay she may play a second ball under Rule 20.1c(3). She **must** report the facts to the Committee before returning her scorecard; otherwise she is subject to **disqualification**.
5. **Pace of Play:** The established Pace of Play for Old Waverly Golf Club is 4:35 for 18 holes. The time to complete each hole is printed on the scorecard. USGA Pace of Play Guidelines governing the championship was provided in the Player Information.
6. **Clubs:** Replacement of broken or significantly broken club: Model Local Rule G-9 is in effect.
